This early education in the importance of communal dialogue and collaboration became an integral part of Hussein's personal philosophy, empowering him with nuances of interpersonal communication that proved essential in his later diplomatic career.

Ambassador Hussein's academic journey began at Kudu Central Primary School, where he enrolled in 1975. During this initial educational phase, he was introduced to the foundational

Each anecdote from his journey underscores the multifaceted development of a diplomat committed to fostering international dialogue and understanding. As he advanced in his career, the lessons learned

from these formative years remained at the forefront, continuously guiding his commitment to promoting effective international relations and collaborative governance.

Humility stands as an essential virtue in the practice of diplomacy - a quality that transcends the mere recognition of one's own limitations. As political theorist John Dewey argued, "The essence of being human is our ability to communicate and connect" (Dewey, 1934). This assertion points to the central function of humility in enabling diplomats to connect and engage constructively with others, which is a cornerstone of effective diplomacy.

Ambassador Hussein exemplifies this principle in his distinguished career. His diplomatic journey reflects the profound impact of humility in building relationships across cultural and national boundaries. In a world increasingly characterized by competition for dominance and influence, Hussein's approach illustrates how humility can serve as a vital tool for fostering international cooperation.

The importance of humility in diplomacy is particularly evident in complex negotiations. Research shows that attributes such as openness, listening skills, and empathy significantly contribute to successful diplomatic engagements (Graham, 2009). Hussein has effectively practiced these attributes, enabling him to navigate the intricate landscapes of diplomacy with grace. His commitment to listening not only to the literal words spoken but also to the nuance behind them - emphasizing cultural and emotional contexts - has been key to his success in foreign relations.

This aspect of humility in diplomacy aligns with the findings of Hofstede's cultural dimensions theory, which highlights the need for cultural awareness to navigate international landscapes successfully (Hofstede, 1984).

### **Personal Attributes of Ambassador Kazaure Hussein**

Ambassador Kazaure Hussein's personal attributes are intrinsically linked to his success as a diplomat. Colleagues consistently describe him as approachable, patient, and attentive - traits that enable him to foster open communication and active collaboration with officials from various countries. His demeanor exemplifies the role of emotional intelligence in diplomacy, which has been shown to enhance negotiation outcomes (Mayer & Salovey, 1997).

One defining aspect of Hussein's character is his inherent willingness to listen, learn, and adapt. These qualities are essential for any diplomat engaged in multifaceted international relations. By practicing active listening, Hussein demonstrates respect for the diverse expertise and experiences of others, regardless of their rank or status (Rogers, 1957). This ability to engage in shared dialogue fosters a positive environment where mutual understanding can flourish.

Hussein's adaptability reflects his understanding of the dynamic nature of international politics. As noted by Goleman (1995), emotional intelligence, which encompasses adaptability,

is essential for successful interpersonal interactions. Hussein's experiences in diverse cultural contexts—from India to Australia - demanded flexibility and an openness to different perspectives. His capacity to navigate these varying circumstances ensures that his interactions are informed, considerate, and productive.

Additionally, Hussein's humble approach to leadership reinforces the significance of resilience in the face of challenges. Negotiations can be fraught with high-stakes tensions and conflicting interests, where the failure to approach issues with humility can lead to escalation and stagnation. However, as noted by Schein (1992), the most effective leaders are those who prioritize understanding and facilitate dialogue among stakeholders. Hussein's willingness to learn from setbacks and engage constructively reflects a leader who values relationships above positional authority.

### **Lessons Learned from Ambassador Hussein's Early Career Experiences**

Ambassador Hussein's early career experiences profoundly informed his understanding of the essence of diplomacy and emphasized the importance of humility. Hussein's journey

offers invaluable insights for future diplomats and reminds us that humility is not merely a trait but a vital strategic asset in the practice of diplomacy.

According to Coate and Lutz (2017), humility in international relations fosters trust and cooperation among nations, allowing for more effective negotiation and problem-solving. Humility is defined not just as a personal trait but also as a vital diplomatic stance that recognizes the importance of listening to other viewpoints and engaging with them thoughtfully. Husseini emerged from the academy equipped with both technical skills and an empathetic approach to diplomacy, thereby promoting a holistic understanding of how culture, history, and social structures shape international relations (Vaughan, 2019).

### **Contributions in Various Departments**

Husseini's transition from the academy to active roles within the Ministry of Foreign Affairs underscored the importance of versatility and adaptability in diplomatic practice. His assignments in varied departments, including the Budget Department and the Protocol Department, provided him with a comprehensive understanding of both the administrative and representational roles crucial for effective diplomacy.

In the Budget Department, Husseini's work focused on the preparation of budget estimates and financial oversight for the Ministry. This role entailed meticulous analyses of spending, planning for future financial needs, and justifying those needs to the Federal Ministry of Finance. etiquette and the subtleties of intercultural communication. As noted by Mlambo (2017), effective protocol management is essential for maintaining positive relationships with foreign governments, as it reflects respect for their culture and traditions.

His experiences across these departments illustrate a well-rounded approach to diplomacy, where both fiscal prudence and cultural diplomacy converge. As Husseinini navigated these roles, he became increasingly aware that successful diplomacy extends beyond governmental interactions; it involves engaging with various stakeholders, including civil society and the private sector (Nimmo, 2019). The capacity to synthesize these diverse experiences has proven invaluable in Husseinini's diplomatic career.

### **Protocol and Bilateral Relations**

Within the Protocol Department, Husseinini's primary responsibility was to facilitate visits by dignitaries and organize bilateral meetings. His willingness to listen and adapt to the needs of others was pivotal in ensuring smooth interactions, which, as noted by Ojo (2020), can profoundly affect the success of diplomatic negotiations. The ability to balance national interests with respect for others has been a hallmark of effective diplomacy, demonstrating that personal characteristics can significantly influence professional outcomes.

In conclusion, Ambassador Husseinini's journey through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs epitomizes the nexus of training, diverse experiences, and the cultivation of humility in the field of diplomacy. From his rigorous education at the Foreign Service Academy to his contributions across various departments, Husseinini exemplifies the essential qualities that define effective diplomacy in the contemporary world. His experiences illustrate that humility, coupled with a keen understanding of both administrative and representational roles, can foster healthier diplomatic relations and contribute positively to the global community.

### **Overseas Diplomatic Missions**

#### **The Experience in Zimbabwe and Professional Growth**

Ambassador Bello Kazaure Husseinini's posting to the Nigerian High Commission in Harare, Zimbabwe, from 1998 to 2000 marked a pivotal chapter in his diplomatic career. Zimbabwe



was at a critical juncture, grappling with profound socio-economic challenges, political turbulence, and a history shaped by colonial legacies and subsequent governance issues. This complex political landscape necessitated a diplomatic approach underscored by adaptability and humility. He launched initiatives such as the Nigeria-India Trade Exchange Forum, facilitating dialogues that connected Nigerian businesses with Indian counterparts. His adept negotiation skills enabled him to encourage Indian businesses to invest in Nigeria's burgeoning telecommunications and agricultural sectors, showcasing the significant potential for bilateral trade. Hussein's commitment to fostering economic ties through humility enabled him to navigate culturally nuanced business discussions, as he effectively translated the interests of both Nigerian and Indian stakeholders (Jones, 2019).

A pertinent example was his orchestration of several trade missions, which allowed for direct engagement with Indian investors. He often emphasized the commonalities between Nigeria and India, advocating the idea that the two nations could collaborate in addressing common challenges, such as food security and technological advancement. His tenure ultimately resulted in an uptick in Indian investments in Nigeria, further reinforcing the efficacy of diplomatic relations grounded in mutual respect (Okwuosa, 2021).

The challenge was particularly acute given reports of labour exploitation affecting foreign workers, including many Nigerians.

He understood that addressing these labour concerns was paramount not merely to safeguard Nigerians in Kuwait but also to maintain Nigeria's international reputation. His respectful engagement with local authorities and labour organizations enabled him to advocate for the rights of Nigerian expatriates without appearing confrontational (Adebayo, 2021).

His approach emphasized dialogue and collaboration. Husseini frequently solicited input from Nigerian workers to ensure their concerns were accurately represented in discussions with Kuwaiti officials. This engagement fostered a sense of trust and belonging among the diasporas. As noted by diplomat and scholar Edward Azar, "Diplomacy thrives on the strength of relationships built through transparency and mutual understanding" (Azar, 2010, p. 92).

Furthermore, Husseini's strategies helped to bridge gaps between Nigerian and Kuwaiti cultures. By encouraging cultural exhibitions and exchange programs, he promoted a deeper understanding between the two nations. His efforts led to improved relations not solely from a diplomatic standpoint but also on a community level, which is crucial for long-term bilateral engagements.

In summary, Ambassador Husseini's experiences in Zimbabwe, India, and Kuwait are emblematic of the nuanced challenges faced by diplomats in diverse contexts. His emphasis on humility as a cornerstone of his diplomatic practice yielded significant outcomes, facilitating trade relations, cultural exchanges, and the safeguarding of Nigerian interests abroad. These experiences underscore the assertion that the practice of diplomacy is as much about personal dispositions and approaches as it is about national interests and policies. Husseini's journey illustrates how effective diplomacy can be achieved through respect, understanding, and a humble approach to building relationships.

The emphasis on collaboration among African nations is essential as it fosters the belief that collective action can lead to better outcomes for the continent—a vision deeply rooted in Hussein's diplomatic philosophy.
